

A new answer site started by Jimmy Wales, founder of Wikipedia, opened for business recently. Wikianswers (http://answers.wikia.com/wiki/ Wikianswers) aims to:



to collaboratively create the best answer to any question, by providing a rich set of facts researched from publicly available sources. Wikianswers is a question and answer site inspired by traditional wiki principles of openness, transparency, and editability...

Anyone can contribute to Wikianswers, *even without registering*. (emphasis added) Wikianswers enables editors to improve answers collaboratively, allowing the best answer to emerge from a process of community consensus.

Not sure how the not registering part would lend creditability to the answers. So, another site to explore and contribute to, if you are sominded. Let us know what you think.

More for Thing 39: Digital Posters

.<u>Glogster</u> is a tool to make online interactive posters. It provides a variety of templates, lots of graphics, fonts, and effects to personalize the look of your poster, and the ability to embed multimedia. This a a fun tool to use

for promotion of library programs, for students to use to present the products of their research, and more.

Glogster generates the code automatically so you can embed the completed posters in a wiki, blog, or Web site. You can even print them out. Be sure to use the/edu site with students; some of the Glogs on the main site are a bit racy!
